

## **Tees Valley Monthly Economic Update – Information Sheet**

The Tees Valley monthly economic update provides a summary of key metrics relevant to the state of the Tees Valley economy. It is updated each month where data becomes available. It is circulated within the combined authority and posted on the [www.teesvalley-ca.gov.uk](http://www.teesvalley-ca.gov.uk) website.

Below are more details about each of the indicators, where they come from and how the figures are calculated.

### **GDP per head**

Source: ONS, Regional economic activity by gross domestic product

Frequency: Annual

Notes: Tees Valley Index is calculated by dividing Tees Valley GDP per head by UK GDP per head.

### **GDP Quarterly Estimates**

Source: ONS, Gross Domestic Product

Frequency: Quarterly

Notes: Chained volume index at basic prices.

### **GVA per hour worked**

Source: ONS, Regional productivity

Frequency: Annual

Notes: Nominal (smoothed) GVA per hour worked.

### **GVA per filled job**

Source: ONS, Regional productivity

Frequency: Annual

Notes: Nominal (smoothed) GVA per filled job.

### **Business Birth Rate**

Source: ONS, Business Demography

Frequency: Annual

Notes: The number of new businesses divided by the overall number of active enterprises. The Tees Valley rate is calculated using local authority data.

### **Businesses**

Source: ONS Nomis, UK Business Counts - Enterprises

Frequency: Annual

Notes: The total number of local business enterprises. The Tees Valley Business Density is the percentage of the UK business rate.

### **Small Medium Enterprises (SME's)**

Source: ONS Nomis, UK Business Counts - Enterprises

Frequency: Annual

Notes: The total number of enterprises with less than 250 employees.

### **North East Goods Exports**

Source: HMRC Regional Trade Statistics

Frequency: Quarterly

Notes: Shows the value of all merchandise trade. It does not include trade of goods between regions in the UK or the trade of services or intangibles. The exports:imports ratio is calculated by dividing the number of exports by the number of imports.

### **Employment Rate %**

Source: ONS Nomis, Annual Population Survey (sample size: 1.3% of total population)

Notes: Employment rate is the number of residents aged 16-64 employed as a percentage of the resident population aged 16-64.

### **Alternative Claimant Count %**

Source: ONS Alternative Claimant Count

Frequency: Quarterly

Notes: The new Alternative Claimant Count from ONS measures the number of people claiming unemployment benefits by modelling what the count would have been if Universal Credit had been in place since 2013 with the broader span of people this covers.

### **Not in Education Employment or Training (NEETS)**

Source: Department for Education

Frequency: Annual

Notes: The number of 16 and 17 year olds who are not in education, employment or training as a number of 16 and 17 year olds known to the local authority. Refugees, asylum seekers and young adult offenders are excluded. Please be aware changes to the way the information is published were made as follows:

2017/18 data is an average of December 2017, January 2018 and February 2018 data.

2018/19 data is an average of December 2018, January 2019 and February 2019 data.

2019/20 data is an average of December 2019, January 2020 and February 2020 data.

Tees Valley is calculated as a simple average of local authority estimates.

### **Number of Jobs**

Source: ONS Nomis, Annual Population Survey – workplace analysis (sample size: 1.3% of total population)

Frequency: Quarterly

Notes: The number of people in employment in Tees Valley. Jobs Density is the number of people employed in Tees Valley per number of people resident in Tees Valley aged 16-64.

### **High Skill Jobs**

Source: ONS Nomis, Annual Population Survey – workplace analysis (sample size: 1.3% of total population)

Frequency: Quarterly

Notes: Number of people in employment in high skill jobs. High skill occupations defined as Managers, Professionals and Associate Professionals. Shows the proportion of high skills jobs as a percentage of all jobs.

### **Median Full Time Weekly Earnings**

Source: ONS Nomis, Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings – resident analysis

Frequency: Annual

Notes: Median weekly gross pay for full time workers.

### **Working Age Population Level 4+ %**

Source: ONS Nomis, Annual Population Survey (sample size: 1.3% of total population)

Frequency: Annual

Notes: The percentage of people aged 16-64 with a level 4 qualification or higher as assigned by the National Qualification Framework

### **Tees Valley Job Vacancies**

Source: Burning Glass Labour Insight

Frequency: Monthly

Notes: The number of jobs vacancies advertised by Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). Approximately 39% of vacancies are excluded because they cannot be allocated to an industry.

42% of vacancies are excluded because they did not specify any skills for the advertised job role.

### **Tees Valley CJRS statistics**

Source: HMRC

Frequency: Monthly

Notes: Eligible employments defined as all cases where the furloughed employee was employed on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2020 and their employer submitted a Real Time Information submission to HMRC by this date.

Eligibility criteria has changed over time with adjustments to the scheme.

### **Tees Valley SEISS statistics**

Source: HMRC

Frequency: Monthly

Notes: Self-employed individuals defined as those who HMRC identified as having traded in the tax year 2018 to 2019 and submitted their Self-Assessment tax return on or before 23 April 2020 for that year.

Eligible population identified as those invited to a claim by HMRC based on information held from their Self-Assessment returns for tax years 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19.

Number of claims defined as those who had submitted a claim for an SEISS grant by 17:59pm on 31st December 2020 and had either paid, sent for payment or had been received and were awaiting various checks.

### **Business Insights and Conditions Survey**

Source: ONS

Frequency: Bi-monthly

Notes: Data is severely limited at the local authority level and unreliable due to sampling variability.
